

Page Styles with Specific Sequence

In CSS, it's possible to target a specific page in the print layout using the `@page` rule combined with the `:nth-child` pseudo-class. For instance, to style the second page, you can use the `@page :nth-child(2)` rule. This example showcases setting the background colors for the second and fourth pages to beige and pink, respectively.

In this example, the second page is targeted using the `@page :nth(2)` rule, and its background color is set to "beige".

In CSS, to differentiate between odd and even pages, you can use the `:nth-child` pseudo-class. Here, the second page and odd-numbered pages are styled with a "beige" background, while even-numbered pages are styled with a "pink" background.
