

## Layout by side float

The left indent in the text is 7cm. Side float is placed inside the right indent of the text.

An image is inserted at the beginning of the paragraph as fo:float. Set 0cm as the indent of fo:float.

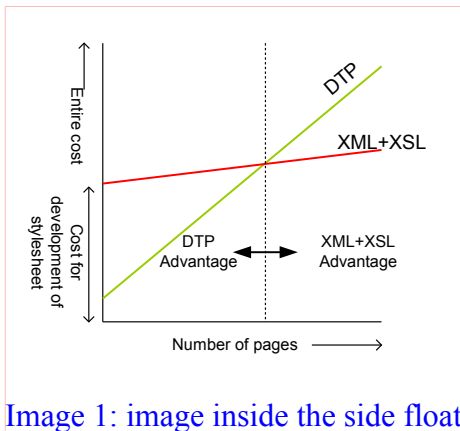


Image 1: image inside the side float

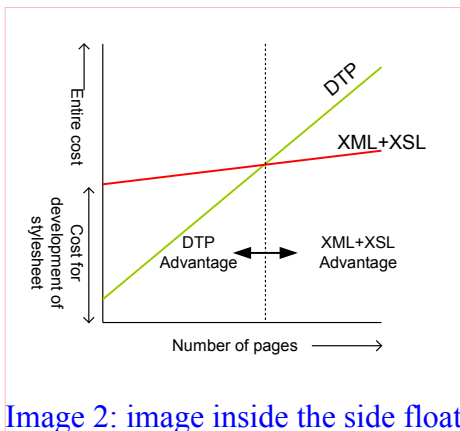
