

# Suppressing duplicate footnotes within the same page

When the same footnote is allotted at several positions within a same page, using `axf:suppress-duplicate-footnote` prevents them from being duplicated and displayed within the same footnote region. In this page, a duplicated display is controlled with `axf:suppress-duplicate-footnote="true"`.
