White space and line breaks in program code

Generally, a monospace font is used when printing source code written in C/C^{++} or Java. Also, as white space has an important meaning in source code, we cannot discard it when printing. Setting the properties white-space="pre" and font-family="monospace" on <fo:block> will preserve the white space in the code and format the white space and text in a monospace font.

The following example was made by simply pasting the unchanged program code into an <fo:block>:

```
void main(void)
{
    printf("Hello, XML world!");
}
```

white-space="pre" is a shorthand property. It works the same as specifying the following:

linefeed-treatment="preserve" white-space-collapse="false" white-space-treatment="preserve" wrap-option="no-wrap"

When wrap-option="no-wrap" is specified, lines will not be wrapped. To wrap lines, specify wrap-option="wrap" (default value).
